A mountain stream runs the length of the painting. It is shown plunging as a waterfall in the high mountains at the top of the painting, becoming a calm stream in the middle of the image. A house on stilts stands in the centre, with utensils for tea making set out on the bank of the stream. Three-line inscription: The picture was painted by Keien in the autumn of the second year of the Meiji period.
