1919

9 SEPTEMBER

Ferenc Hopp dies. Under the terms of his will, the Ferenc Hopp Museum of Eastern Asiatic Arts is founded, coming under the administrative control of the Hungarian Museum of Fine Arts. Work on systemising Ferenc Hopp's collection begins under the expert leadership of Dr Zoltán Felvinczi Takács, the first director of the Hopp Museum
